


"My intension is to abstract a figurative landscape into chromatic and tonal values, creating a new memory. In part they are emotional responses to old memories of places I have visited."

### A Clue to Each Time & Place

Munro has given each artwork a label that presents clues to its location and time: a date, the original 360-degree image from which Munro was inspired, a map, and latitude and longitude coordinates.

The chosen typeface is an important part of the artwork. Munro chose an alpha-numeric font that reminds him of his childhood in the 1970s; Kodak Instamatic images were imprinted with this font.

At this same time, Munro is exhibiting other Time & Place landscapes of Australia at the Heide Museum of Modern Art in Melbourne, which follow the same "clue" label format.
