For 10 years, Karl has influenced the design, installation and maintenance of some of the finest horticulture displays under glass. Prior to joining Longwood, he completed academic internships at Walt Disney World in Orlando, Florida and the Filoli Estate in the San Francisco Bay area of California.

Karl's signature strength of using pallets of colored foliage trees, shrubs and perennials is also the focus of his professional lectures that he gives nationwide and his horticulture classes as part of Longwood Gardens' Continuing Education Program.
